## **Fathers** take chargel

THE Office of the Family Advocate helps many people to sort out their difficulties.

Zibuze Kunene of Dads in the Picture, which works closely with the Office of the Family Advocate, told Daily Sun that the more you speak to fathers about their kids, the more you get a positive response.

"We encourage fathers to play a meaningful role in the lives of children, even neighbours' children,"

He said it was unfortunate sometimes that cops create animosity between fighting parents.

'In most cases, it is the mothers who run to the police and then dads go into defensive mode," he said.

He said this is where the Office of the Family Advocate is very useful. "The advocate is a neutral mediator. In this office, both parents are equal," he said.

Jannie Kruger said he was sceptical in 2005 when he started proceedings but his ideas changed after working with the family advocate, especially with professionals such as Salomie Langeveldt and senior advocate Chris Maree.

"I recommend that parents should contact them and get free expert advice. I have never known such professionalism," he said.

In 2007 Jannie was the first father after the introduction of the amended act to receive a favourable decision. Dr Norbert Peter, who is based in Australia, first came into contact with this office in 2007 and again in 2012. On both occasions his daughter had been abducted and she was successfully sent back.

"Both times, I could pick up my daughter in Pretoria and bring her back to Australia. My daughter is very thankful that I fought for her. I was supported in an excellent professional way," he said.
